President's Columnby Bruce Burton

It's difficult to imagine that we are almost halfway through our table tennis season. We have had a number of very successful tournaments, and our coaching program has worked out well. But, there is still room for a great deal of improvement. The biggest problem facing us is the fact that most of the work has fallen into the hands of a dedicated few.

Under these circumstances there is the constant danger that even those few will eventually become totally frustrated and move away from table tennis. In the past we have lost people because they have been very much overburdened and I would hate to think what would happen if this occurred again.

When you consider what has been accomplished with just a handful of individuals, think how much we could do with more volunteers. But they do have to be dedicated volunteers a half-hearted attempt can do us more harm than good. Several times this fall our association has been let down by individuals who promised to do something but didn't. We always manage to get by however, and we continue to hope that things will improve.

Turning to more cheerful matters, I am delighted to see the number of young players coming into the game. Cecil Keade and I gave a clinic at Gander in November and, although the numbers were low, the players were, as one of their teachers said, "table tennis fanatics." I very much enjoyed working with the group and was encouraged to see their excellent showing at the Mt. Pearl Open. This kind of success will hopefully further promote table tennis in Gander, which I can see becoming one of our strongest centres in the next couple of years.

I would like to see more coaching clinics after Christmas and I'm pleased to say we have no shortage of coaches willing to help at clinics. It's the key to developing table tennis in Newfoundland.

I would like to extend Season's Greetings to everyone associated with table tennis.

Report of the Gander Open

Players from Springdale took home seven out of eight titles in the Gander Junior Open Table Tennis Championships at St. Paul's Central High School in Gander on Saturday 24 November. The event, which was organised by Jim Hayter and the Gander Boys and Girls Club, drew participants from Clarenville, Swift Current and Springdale as well as Gander.

Bentley Hancock and Denise Perry of Springdale were the most successful players in the tournament with Bentley capturing four and Denise taking three gold medals.

Fourteen-year-old Hancock won his first-ever under 17 boys' open singles title when he outpointed Perry Joy of Springdale 21-12, 21-13.

In the semi-finals, Bentley downed Chris Brych of Gander 21-15, 21-11 and Perry edged Mike Mullaly of Gander 21-9, 21-17. The under 15 boys' singles final also featured Hancock and Joy, but this time Hancock was extended to three games before winning 15-21, 21-13, 21-10. Hancock had a scare in the semi-final when he squeaked by Mullaly 21-17, 19-21, 21-19. Joy made it to the final by getting the verdict 21-18, 21-17 over his younger brother Charles.

Bentley Hancock's other two titles came in the boys' doubles and the mixed doubles, the finals of which were all-Springdale affairs. Hancock teamed up with Perry Joy to defeat Charles Joy and Brian Ramjattan 21-19, 21-16 in one final, while Hancock and Denise Perry outplayed Perry Joy and Gaye Dalley 21-19, 21-18 in the other.

As expected, Denise Perry, the reigning Atlantic Provinces under-15 girls champion, won the under 17 girls singles crown with ease, disposing of Gaye Dalley 21-13, 21-10 in the final. Dalley had earlier won a good semi-final match over rising Springdale star Roxanne Bouzane 21-11, 12-21, 21-13.

Denise Perry's third gold came in the girls doubles in which she partnered Gaye Dalley to get past Roxanne Bouzane and Angela Heath, also of Springdale, in 22-20, 21-15 scores.

The under-15 girls singles event was won by Gaye Dalley who defeated Springdale teammate Denise Taylor in straight 21-14, 21-18 games. Springdale was unable to quite manage a clean sweep of the medals as Gander's Rob Kieley, playing in his very first open tournament, captured the under-13 boys singles title with a 22-20, 21-14 victory over second-placed Jeff Simms of Springdale.

Report of the Ashford's Pharmacy Mt. Pearl Open

Players from Mt. Pearl captured five of the thirteen titles decided in the Ashford's Pharmacy Mt. Pearl Open Table Tennis Championships at Mt. Pearl Central High School on Saturday 1st December. Four golds went

to St. John's while Gander and Conception Bay South took two apiece.

Outstanding among four double winners was 14-year-old Derek French of Mt. Pearl who, playing in his first tournament, took home gold medals in the "E" singles and junior doubles. In the "E" singles, French triumphed over an entry of 27, defeating Wade Newman of Paradise 21-18, 21-19 in the final after downing Gander's Chris Brych 17-21, 21-18, 21-19 in semi-final action. Newman's path to the final was via a 22-20, 21-19 semi-final victory over Ron Fitzpatrick of Gander. In an all-Mt. Pearl junior doubles final, French won his second gold by teaming up with Dave Brophy to defeat Darryl Penney and Kerry Pope 21-18, 22-20.

Mt. Pearl's other three golds went to Darryl Penney, Stewart Howell and Greg Howell. Darryl Penney, in undoubtedly a personal best performance, took a particularly strong "C" singles field by surprise, edging Nghia Lee of St. John's 12-21, 23-21, 21-19 in the final. Stewart Howell succeeds Mike Ryan as the new under-15 boys singles champion. He disposed of Mike Brinson of Gander 21-7, 21-5 in the semi-final and squeaked by rookie Tom Lambert of Mt. Pearl 22-20, 22-20 in the final. Lambert only just made it through the semis, winning 14-21, 21-14, 21-19 against Roy Normore of St. John's. In a repeat of the under-13 boys singles event of the Molson Avalon Open in September, Greg Howell took first place over John Russell of St. John's on 21-19, 21-12 scores.

The "B" singles and youth singles crowns both went to Eric Cranford of Paradise. Cranford topped the "B" singles with a 21-14, 21-17 semi-final win over Lorne Rideout of St. John's and a 21-14, 14-21, 21-14 final success over Frank O'Brien of St. John's. O'Brien reached the final by overcoming Tony Gosse of Paradise 21-19, 21-16. Cranford had a tougher time in the youth singles, for players between the ages of 17 and 21, as he won a 21-15, 17-21, 23-21 cliff-hanger final over Tony Gosse.

Chris Brych, 14, of Gander added two more trophies to his collection with the "D" singles and his first under-17 boys singles victory. Brych topped an entry of 32 in the "D" singles, beating top-seeded Darryl Nixon of Brownsdale, Trinity Bay 21-17, 21-19 in one semi-final and going on to

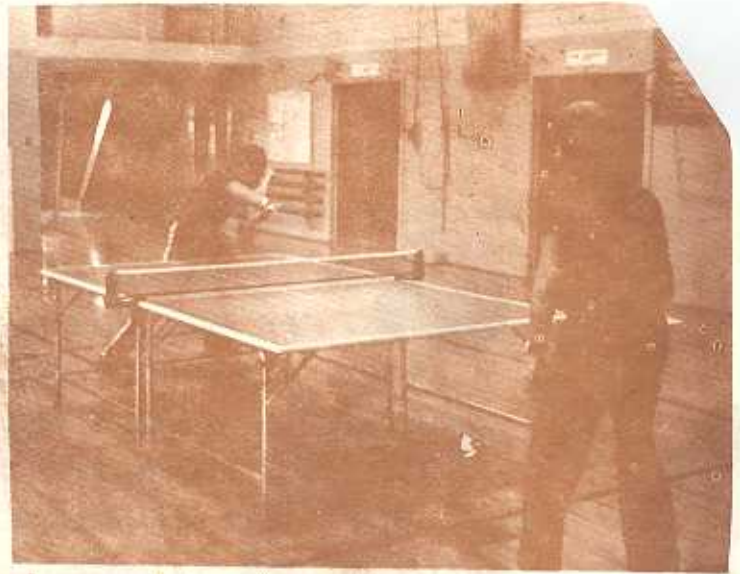

defeat second-seeded Darryl Penney 17-21, 21-10, 21-18 for the title. Penney had earlier outpointed Claude Soper of St. John's 21-17, 19-21, 21-18. In the final rounds of the under-17 boys singles, Brych got past two Mt. Pearl players, Dave Brophy and Kerry Pope, on identical 21-19, 22-20 scores. Pope reached the final after ousting Wade Newman 21-18, 21-9.

Marlene Bourne of St. John's was a double winner in both the ladies and the under-17 girls singles events. Each event was a round-robin affair with Debbie Howell of Mt. Pearl playing second fiddle in both. In the ladies singles, Bourne overcame Howell 21-9, 21-16, while in the under-17 girls singles the scores were 21-11, 21-19.

The only title which did not change hands was the "A" singles, won by Alan Cornish after a hard-fought final over provincial number 5 Bruce Burton of St. John's 21-14, 22-20, 21-18. Burton had his chances when he led 20-19 in the second game and 17-13 in the third but Cornish won out with a mixture of spin serves and topspin attack. Bruce earlier had a close call in getting past Harrison Lamswood of Topsail 21-19, 27-25, while Alan's toughest match was in overcoming Tony Gosse 21-18, 21-11.

Burton partnered Nghia Lee to take the senior doubles title. The final action saw the pair defeat Eric Cranford and Tony Gosse 21-11, 18-21, 21-19.

The tournament drew 52 players from Gander, Clarenville, Trinity Bay, Conception Bay South, Mt. Pearl and St. John's. The N.L.T.T.A would like to thank Bruce Burton for stepping in at very short notice and running the tournament after the sudden and unexpected indisposition of Eamonn O'Brien. The association would also like to thank Ashford's Pharmacy for their generous sponsorship of the championships.

Since our last newsletter there have been two clinics held in the province. On November 8th, John Warr and Kathy Wells travelled to Labrador and gave clinics at Churchill Falls on the 8th, North West River on the 9th, Goose Bay on the 10th and Labrador City on the 11th. Well over 60 players attended these four clinics with excellent turnouts at both Churchill Falls and Goose Bay. New Ratings

Some reshuffling of positions has taken place since the last newsletter, both in the Newfoundland and the Atlantic rankings. These ratings were produced on December 14th.

Provincial association president Bruce Burton has been in top form all season and is making strides to regain his former glory after a season in the comparative wilderness. Now Bruce is up to 4th place and out to catch John Warr. Meanwhile John is temporarily out of action nursing a broken collar bone

In the Newfoundland ladies list it is former provincial champion Nancy Janes who makes the news by coming out of retirement to play in the St. John's league. Nancy is now rated number three and it will be interesting to see how 4th ranked Denise Perry and 5th placed Ruth Windsor, neither of whom were big names when Nancy last played, will fare against Nancy in the future.

One or two newcomers have jumped in at the deep-end at the first shot: Rod Snow of St. John's stands at number 21, Nghia Lee of St. John's is number 23 and Springdale's Larry Bouzane is number 45, while 13-year-old Roxanne Bouzane of Springdale is doing great at number 14.

And speaking of thirteen year olds, Gaye Dalley of Springdale is flying high at number 9 (up 9 places) and Stewart Howell of Mt. Pearl is giant-killing at number 34 (up 11 places) since the last newsletter.

On the Atlantic front the return to P.E.I. table tennis of sisters Kellye and Laura Crockett has shaken up the Atlantic ladies list. Kellye returns to lord it from number 1 spot in the Atlantics (so Kathy Wells is demoted to number 2), while Laura is back at number 4. This puts Val Haines of Upper Gullies down to number 6, with Nancy Janes at number 8. On the Atlantic men's list Alan Cornish and Mike Ryan retain their 9 and 10 rankings.
